

Using water more carefully: list behaviours, appliances and technologies

- Hotter, drier climate
- More extreme weather events (droughts/floods)
- Decline in rainfall by 20% in west of state
- Increasing population

- Short showers
- Water-saving showerheads
- Water tanks
- Front loader washing machines
- Dishwashers
- Drought resistant gardens
- Considering embodied water in food
- Irrigation upgrades

Increasing water sources: we can't just depend on the tap water from our reservoirs. List other water sources:

Water users: who uses water and how?

- Recycled water-purple pipes
- Rainwater (individual homes)
- Centralised rainwater collection from rooftops (Warrnambool example)
- Onsite water cleaning and reuse
- Sea water (desalination)
- State water grid moving water to where it is needed via pipelines

- Farmers growing crops / livestock
- Food manufacture processing our food
- Zoo for animals and enclosures
- Plastic pellet manufacture cooling towers
- Holiday makers water skiing/ recreation
- Environment: ecosystems rely on water for life and growth
- First Nations eel farming
